

We'd love your thoughts about the website, and some feedback, so come and take a visit. I'm sure



I recently found myself reading Jesus' words in Mark's gospel. The disciples have been arguing about who is the greatest. Jesus' response is telling;

'He took a little child and had him stand among them. Taking him in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me."' (Mark 9:36)

There's just one problem, one very big problem.

It seems so much of the church has forgotten what God put it here to do. Or even worse, maybe we have not forgotten but have chosen the comfort of inaction over action, the false safety of doing nothing to reach the lost instead of the challenges of getting our hands dirty with the sinners, the downtrodden, the difficult & the anti-social. Oh if wishing made it so. But God did not wish, God calls and commands us to be reconcilers of this world to Himself. (2 Cor 5:18)

Fact: Over 80% of people begin their life journey of Christian faith between 4 & 14 years of age. Fact: Less than 10% of church resources & incomes are spent on direct ministry to children & youth.

Fact: In Australia only 4% of children are involved with any type of regular Christian ministry.

Fact: Only 2% of Aussie kids belong to Christian churches.

Fact: And less than that 2% of Aussie kids are to be found in evangelical, Bible believing churches.

So what can we do? If you and your church want to do more than SUSA can help.

Our schools are the one place where the church can connect with almost every child. We still have the legal permission to bring Christian teaching into schools. During Christmas, Easter & throughout the year, SU & Inter-Church teams are involved in dozens of schools taking the truth about Jesus to children. But we could do more if only we had the volunteers and the finances.

Will you help us do more? Pray first & then take action. Our children are growing up in a godless, immoral world & their only hope is Jesus. And YOU & your church may be their only hope of hearing about Him.

To the unaware, there are new requirements for volunteers in schools. DECD are requiring all volunteers to have a DCSI Employment Screening (another type of Police Check) and to undergo further training in 'Responding to Abuse & **Neglect**' (a bit like Mandatory Notification).

Now all volunteers who minister in schools must do R.A.N. and have a DCSI Employment Screening. There are no exceptions.

SUSA is working with SMG, who are authorised to provide the training in order to make R.A.N available to as many people as possible. So please spread the word to any of the SUSA volunteers you are connected with, or church volunteers who minister in schools.

You can also do R.A.N at the SUSA Youth Training day on June 28th, along with Childsafe Team Member training.

Special Projects Manager and former Acting State Director Les Dennis has been invited to the position as the new SUSA Missions Coordinator. This is one-day a week position with a build up of days as the Mission season starts.

Les in fact became a Christian through a Beach Mission on the South Coast of Sydney some 50 years ago (he must be really old). He visited the Port Vincent and Moonta Bay Missions this year and was glowing in his reports back to SUSA on how well organised the program and activities flowed. The children and teenagers really loved being involved and several parents remarked it was good that great role models ministered to the kids.

"Learning about Jesus was great fun" one enthusiastic 11 year old girl remarked to Les.

Former State Director Mark Schultz who has many years of experience with Beach Mission and is passionate for this ministry of SUSA will brief Les on the requirements of his new role.

Les will continue his Special Projects role trying to attract funds for programs and equipment by making grant applications to funding bodies and philanthropic trusts when he can.

"The list of potential projects and equipment I have been asked to explore funding for grows weekly to the extent that a priority listing needs to be worked on" Les remarked. There are some exciting possibilities for a Youth Ministry in the Mid North City of Port Pirie driven by a local network of Christians.

A potentially exciting project that Les will be working with the State Director on will be exploring the potential of an SUSA base at Victor Harbor that will have an inter-agency approach

Les also works closely with SUSA's 'Kids at Risk' worker, Lochy Cupit as the liaison volunteer between Prison Fellowship and SUSA with the management of the PK (Prisoners Kids) Camps, there are now eight camps a year of which SUSA currently manage four. We continue to seek camp directors and leaders who will commit to work with the Teenage Boys PK Camps. Les believes that there has to be a church that has appropriate men for this special ministry.

Les is very grateful for the practical, prayerful and financial support he receives and asks for continuance of this.


