Girls' time to 'Shine'

Girls – now it's your turn! **JEWELS Camp** is a brand new initiative from SUSA. This camp is open to girls in years 7-10, with girls in years 11 & 12 welcome to attend as junior leaders. We aim to show young women their true worth, and ultimately their true identity in Christ.

Research shows that how a girl sees herself is affected by a variety of influences around her. Therefore, the objectives of the camp seek to address four specific areas:

1. Community.
2. Identity (internal & external).
3. Respectful relationships.
4. Rites of passage.

Jewels Camp, and its subsequent program of community and mentoring, intends to help build confidence, resilience and esteem in young women through supportive networks and relationships.



These qualities are needed to address the mountain of issues facing young women in today's society.

The camp will be from 13th-16th October 2016, at Willow Creek Camp near Victor Harbor.

All girls are welcome, regardless of faith and background.

We thank and praise God for another wonderful CE camp; our 90th! Our vision for camp is that "As many young people as possible will have a genuine encounter with Jesus, being encouraged and equipped to serve Him wholeheartedly." To this end we prayed and endeavoured, and this is what we can report:

With 215 campers: 50 from the country and 90 passionate volunteers, this camp was big! Dave MacGillivray, our speaker explored the impact of the resurrection on the followers of Jesus through the book of Acts and challenged and encouraged campers to be witnesses to Jesus.

During camp the youth were engaged, fun, respectful, courageous and kind. The culture and atmosphere of camp is a special thing that is hard to find elsewhere; it was a true joy to minister to and with them!

We partnered in mission again this year with a community in Copley, Central Australia and saw 5 Aboriginal boys join us. We began a new partnership with Scripture Union - Vanuatu. It was great to see so many campers get on board with supporting mission.

This year 9 campers decided to follow Jesus for the first time and a large number made recommitments to Jesus; many indicating a desire to read their bible more, pray more and share Jesus more with their friends.

One camper put it: "I can't wait to restart my life with Jesus" and another: "I've decided to go throughout my life and take any chance to spread the Word about Jesus."

We are excited to see how God might continue to bear fruit in these young lives!

Family Beach Missions

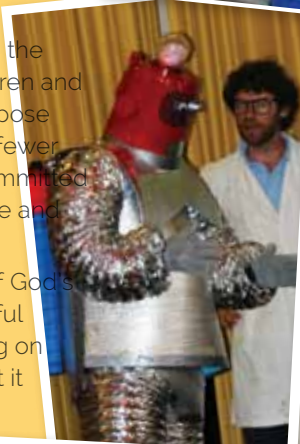
How will they know if no one tells them?

BIG WEEK OUT

2016 saw a new exciting partnership develop between SUSA and Big Week Out. For 15 years BWO has been running to help young people get out, get their hands dirty and express their passion for Jesus through service.

Over 190 young people across 3 sites, from January 18th to 22nd, shared God's love to their community through doing everything from backyard blitzes, free car washes, painting schools and clowning.

This year was an undeniable success with the highest level of excitement BWO has seen in recent years. There's something very powerful seeing High School kids blessing people's lives in such a distinct way.

Stories and examples of God's at work during the week are coming to light every day, however, one Backyard Blitz this year saw 30 kids over 4 days transform an elderly gentleman's backyard from an overgrown hazard to a functioning veggie patch. At the end of the fourth day, he asked 5 kids to pray for him, for his health and for him to rediscover God.
