So often as we look at the world today we look at the demands placed on us, look at how much more we could do if only we had more staff, people or money. We are in danger, perhaps, of only seeing the looming, very large mountains we think we need to climb.

Recently, Scripture Union Australia has been looking at the possibilities of how states might be able to support each other better. Nationally, there are over 10,000 volunteers and in South Australia we have around 800. That is amazing! Quite an enterprise, one might say. How is this? Well, 2 Corinthians 8:5 might give us a clue. Paul wrote about the grace of God to the Macedonians during a very difficult time.

'The trial exposed their true colors: They were incredibly happy, though desperately poor. The pressure triggered something totally unexpected: an outpouring of pure and generous gifts. I was there and saw it for myself. They gave offerings of whatever they could - far more than they could afford!-pleading for the privilege of helping out in the relief of poor Christians.

This was totally spontaneous, entirely their own idea, and caught us completely off guard. What explains it was that they had first given themselves unreservedly to God and to us. The other giving simply flowed out of the purposes of God working in their lives.'

Kel Beams (Collective Shout) held a captivating presentation on how advertising and the media sexualizes and objectifies women and the impact that has for girls in their self-esteem, value and image. She spoke on how the proliferation of pornography is impacting the current generation of girls and boys. Girls commented afterwards that this information had 'blown their minds' and had totally changed their thinking.

Chris Battistuzzi presented on how girls and boys are wired differently when it comes to sex and relationships. He emphasized how highly God valued each girl and that all girls should expect care and respect from boys.

Jo Paynter shared a powerful talk on how Jesus views women compared to how our culture views women.

Jesus was woven into all issues discussed at JEWELS and many girls gave feedback revealing a new understanding of how Jesus was relevant to their lives

GENTS Camp SA #3 decided to pick the 50 year storm! I'm still trying to work out what transcendent purpose there was in the Onkaparinga River, which split our campsite, surging from 10 metres to 300 metres wide. Nearly every activity had to be changed or rearranged. It was

through God's goodness that when we had to venture outdoors for pre-booked activities, the weather did allow us to.

It was so encouraging to hear and see campers engaged in worship and spiritual input as much as all other activities on camp. I've not seen teen boys love worship quite like they did this year on camp. Since camp, I've already heard of a camper not from a Christian background take his father along to church because he was inspired by GENTS Camp worship!

The leaders' testimonies again this year were very real and honest about the difficult journey to manhood, which set the tone for campers being honest with themselves and with others.
