The encouraging news is that SUSA Schools Ministry reaches about 20,000 students each year through our Christian Option Programs, SUPA programs, seminars, Christmas and Easter presentations and SUPA clubs.

We currently have 4 SUPA clubs (maintaining close ties with their school community) and we continue to have faithful volunteers persevering against the odds and presenting COPs to many children.



We are still working on redeveloping our COP material making it more relevant for today's children. This all takes time, work, training and money.

SUSA is committed to doing whatever we can, not just to stay in the school space but to expand. As one teacher recently said, "Australia has a Christian history and it's important for the students to learn about that."

We are seeking more volunteers, churches and financial supporters to partner with us so that more students don't miss out on hearing about Jesus.

ARK MINISTRY Sets Sail



ntroducing A.R.K (At-Risk Kids) our new name for the At-Risk department. At SUSA we have a great vision for ARK and hope the department will grow to include new programs and new camps for disadvantaged or displaced children.

As a fantastic start, we have secured funding from the SA Council of Churches for our developing ministry with refugee children and their families.

Project Harmony will include two camps per year plus ongoing activities, connecting children from refugee and migrant families with their local community. This helps to facilitate an understanding of Australian culture, a sharing of their original culture and exposure to the basics of the Christian faith. Camp Harmony for 2017 is planned for November 10-12.

Promotion for JEWELS Camp 2017 begins in June and the theme is Garden of Unearthly Delights. The camp will illustrate that a girl's heart is like a garden which needs to be nurtured, and like the original Garden (Eden), is a sacred space to walk with Jesus. The activities will follow a festival theme and include circus skills, acrobatics, fire twirlers, parkour, dance and much more. Look out for it on our Wired Youth website.
