Sharing the love of Jesus



The theme of this year's GENTS Camp was 'Future > Past'. A drama narrative developed the story of a typical father/son relationship over four successive generations since World War 2 and showed typical dysfunctionality that is passed on when pain and hurt is not healed. This provided a great opportunity for boys to see how Jesus not only forgives sins, but heals hearts to break generational 'curses'.

Leaders shared the reality of their challenges growing up into men and how faith had given hope and new life. Personally

I found my small groups regrounded my conviction of how important Jesus is for all of Australia. A number of campers expressed they had great fathers and in stark contrast, there were boys who shared painfully how they either didn't have a dad or their father was in prison for amongst other things, beating them. One Yr 10 boy was so moved by this he asked for prayer that God would help him find and support boys in need in his community who didn't have good dads.

For many of the boys GENTS Camp crossed socio-economic,

The mention of the word 'camp' may well conjure up memories of being on a camp as a young person which was organised by Scripture Union or some other Christian group.

SU continues to provide many camping opportunities that endeavour to meet the social, physical, emotional and spiritual needs of young people. Christian camps can have a huge impact on a person's faith and help campers encounter and respond to Jesus' call on their lives.

As Jacob found in Genesis 32:1-2, these encounters can be more than a little surprising! "Jacob went on his way and the angels of God met him; and when Jacob saw them he said, "This is God's camp!" So he called that place Mahanaim. 'Mahanaim' – two camps.

The first camp was Jacob's – vulnerable with all his family and flocks as he left his uncle Laban to return to face his brother Esau.

The second was God's camp, with angels protecting Jacob, meeting him just where he was – camped on the dusty road, at the hour of his need.

SUSA Active in Schools



During Term 3 we saw 200 students opening up the New Testament and hearing about Jesus with Christian Option Programs running in schools. Children who may never have heard about Jesus or opened a Bible, receive their own gospel and hear directly what Christians believe and why Jesus is so important. It is also encouraging to meet with those kids who are Christian in the schools and encourage them as they walk their path with Jesus as well.

This term also saw the trial run of the redeveloped “Believe It or Not - Beliefs and Values” program with Burnside Primary School. Kids got to read about the characters “Adele” and “Dylan” and interact with the program content in a new and dynamic way.

The aim is to bring out the important lessons that the leaders are teaching, and put them onto a visual platform, so that when they look at the booklet, the message is clear, consistent and ready for them to relearn.

There was much positive and helpful feedback to the new format and a few fixes are needed but we are 95% there and it will soon be ready for the rest of the schools! After this, it’s onto the next COP for redevelopment.

SUPA Growth

As SUSA goes through a period of change and discernment of where God wants us to go, we are clearly seeing God open new doors into SUPA Club ministry.

Traditionally lunch time clubs, we now have 3 SUPA Clubs operating outside of school hours, running in a partnership between SUSA and local churches. Added to this have been 2 SUPA Holiday Clubs which are 3 or 4 day outreaches to local kids.

We have had further interest in SUPA Clubs from other regions and are working to develop a new ministry model around this exciting new area of mission and ministry that God is opening up.

This year SU has been promoting the ministry of Quizworks, which run Christmas and Easter Seminars into Primary Schools. While not an SU ministry we are very supportive and have been happy to use our networks to promote Quizworks. In the end it’s all about more children hearing the good news of Jesus.

At SU we are kingdom focussed, not ‘us’ focussed. The programs we use don’t necessarily need to carry our brand or label, it just needs to share the gospel with sensitivity, quality and God’s love!

Seven girls gave their hearts to their new Saviour and most others made meaningful recommitments of faith.

Our Yr 11 and 12 leadership initiates participated in rites of passage activities to discover their pathway to womanhood and their identity as women in God.

A year of prayer for a strong leadership team was answered and we had 14 exceptional leaders who drove the united culture of the camp. Prayers for a worship team were answered wonderfully with four new young leaders exploding into worship ministry by leading the most intimate and powerful campfire worship we've ever experienced.



The spectacular finale of the camp, organised by Dianne Kenyon from Clare Uniting, was a talent concert lit by flame torches. The excitement of the girls performing a diverse range of dance, drama, comedy, singing and acrobatics had everyone in stitches one minute and thoughtful reflection the next.
